With Rev. William C. Graham

Fr. William Graham is a professor of historical theology at the College of St. Scholastica in Duluth, Minnesota, where he also directs the Braegelman Program in Catholic Studies. Fr. Bill is a priest of the Duluth Diocese where he served for 10 years as pastor prior to further studies and teaching assignments. He has been a visitor to St. John Vianney in 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2009.

His theme during a 2004 parish mission at SJV was entitled, "Clothed in Christ," which is the title of a book he finished writing while visiting here — **Clothed in Christ: Toward a Spirituality for Lay Ministers** (Twenty-Third Publications). His latest book was released this February – **A Catholic Handbook** (Paulist Press).
